I plan to pick up a Tascam DM4800 digital mixer to server as the frontend for the new PC. Currently it has an RME Multiface as its i/o and is running Samplitude, Reaper, and N-Tracks. When the DM4800 makes it into the studio, I may consider Sonar or Cubase for tighter control surface integration. Also, I have a Muse Receptor, and would like to get it more in the signal path too.

At that time, Paris will move over to be the mixdown system, so I will have a 2-card setup with ADAT + analog transfer capability of up to 32 tracks.

As always, we make this up as we go, so who knows what the final configuration will be, but I am really looking forward to getting the DM4800 here and playing with it.
