but why? Because the people who put them in office - voters and special interest groups with a loud voices and voter sway - spend time keeping their pet issues in the public's ear, whether they really need attention or not. So we hear what politicians think will get them elected, and we vote based on that. We also spend personal time concerned with issues that aren't going to save starving people in 3rd world countries. It's the case of "my problem is my world" instead of "it's our world, maybe my problem isn't a big deal after all". A free market, consumer based society unfortunately breeds a self centered mentality, and hence we get greed increasing daily. If we were a people of community/world mindedness and true selfless action, we would probably be having a very different, more optimistic conversation. Just think what we could be doing for countries like Sudan and Ethiopia if we were that kind of nation.

Unions at times have had their place - for underpaid laborers in countries or businesses with poor or no safety and wage laws and ethics. But having worked in businesses with unions, and seen how they operate in other businesses, they aren't always the common-good protectors they once may have seemed. They have a very strong political presence, needless to say, and it isn't all about better wages for \$40/hr assembly line workers that pay significant dues for the right. E.g. In Massachusetts, a police or highway patrol officer is required by law (passed due to efforts from law enforcement unions) to be present at every construction site, accruing off-duty pay - often triple time as much work there is done overnight and weekends. One police chief in a local town made 6 figures - over twice his salary - simply for sitting at a road construction sites, even if it was in a one-house cul-de-sac with no traffic to direct (and they never do anyway). Who pays for this? Tax payers in higher income, gas, and sales taxes, and road tolls, even for roads that are paid for.

There was no proven safety need and actually is often causes more traffic problems than it solves as they are just sitting in cars with lights flashing - it was well know that it was just a union perk. When organizations truly work for the common good, then their value is self-evident. But when the purpose is to bully one another until someone cries uncle, that purpose is diminished to nothing more than a power struggle.

Cubase is on second computer interfaced with an RME hdsp9652 card using all 3 ADAT outs + spdif + ADAT Sync + wordclock + MIDEX8. These gives me 26 digital outputs from cubase to paris in PERFECT sync and excelent midi timing for external synths.

All that 26 outputs from cubase + all my hardware synthesizers + hardware fx are connected to paris and all mixing and tracking is done in paris.

If you want to make another rig for midi and vsti, it's very important that you choose a soundcard with adat sync and asio2 sync capable software. It's crucial if you want perfect sync between paris and sequencing software.

As I know, RME + cubase (5.1 or SX or nuendo) is an excelent combination... Actually, I'm using an trusty Cubase 5.2 with midex8. Check for samplitude asio2 sync support, I not sure about it....

>I have a different story...

Connect an T adapter to second MEC (slave) WC input,  
another T adapter to audiofire WC input.

Without T adapters on first and last device.

Now connect wordclock from MEC A (master) WC output thru  
T adapter on the second MEC then thru T adapter of the audiofire  
and end up in WC input of layla.

You can switch places of layla and audiofire if needed for shorter  
cable runs... Btw, as the chain is shorter - the beter!

At first, try without any termination.  
Put paris to "internal sync" and layla and audiofire to  
slave/external/wordclock. (very important!)

I have had very similar setup for years without any digital sync problems.  
Infact, my setup was a little more complicated...

It was 2xMEC + 2xRMEhdsp9652 + TC electronic M3000.  
All in wordclock chain and all conected digitally and perfectly  
synced + adat sync to cubase. Without termination.  
Complete chain was about 6 meters long.

Now I have 4xEDS and 4xMEC, and that is a totaly different story.... ;-)

If you consider some sync problems and clicking, try to terminate  
first and last device adding T adapters and 75ohm terminators...

The fact is that it worked for me for years!  
And remember, it's crucial that everything but your master MEC is  
set to WC slave.

...and use quality cables.
