Here's why:

The boot drive in those is pretty primitive and there are no drives that will drop in to replace it because of the issue with transfer speed in that computer. Basically, the computer has a max transfer speed from the drive (ATA 66 I think) and if you put a modern drive in there, the computer sets the drive to

"max output speed" on boot and then the computer cannot address the drive any more. grrrrr...

but takes up a card slot. So you are limited to 2 EDS cards. Even the G4's (and some will boot OS9 and some will not) run a lot better with a host card and and a modern drive.

Can you live with 2 cards?
