Move that file into whatever folder you have your other VST plugins located, de-install the CubaseLE software & now you've got a KILLER reverb with nice rooms & halls, plus an assortment of other things, all with very smooth tails, for a buck-and-a-quarter.

Haven't yet figured out what to do with the Alpha unit itself, except perhaps use it as a doorstop. :)
