I can certainly add another MIDI track at #23, but then I'd have this orphan MIDI track hanging out in the middle of nowhere. Granted this does nothing more than affront my slightly OCD sensibilities, but I have a hard time believing that Paris doesn't have a track move/delete function. Am I missing it?

On a side note, has anyone thought to make a package of the original Paris skin? I downloaded the new skins from the parisfaqs site, but I didn't see the original skin. I'm working on the whole skinning for the Mac bit, and I need a copy of the original BMP for comparison. If anybody has them handy, could you send them along?
