moved on due to the failed MIDI implementation in PARIS and the lack of OSX support.

I now use Logic Pro along with a boatload of astonishing synth/FX plugins. My MOTU 828MII along with eight extra mic pres and outputs on the ADAT i/o gives me more inputs and outputs than I had with PARIS.

Moving synths/samplers and FX into the computer allowed me to lose several full racks of outboard gear while g
