Lotus Domino/Notes Servers.

While @ GM & Ford during the mac years, I can tell you stories all day and
night about their performance. I was a Mac Snob in the worst way.
It was until both we went to windows based machines (gateways&Compaqs @Dells)
did we (IT crew) noticed (in disbelief) that the PC workstations and Servers
were Blazing!!!

Before, with the macs we used the built-in Apple Talk for networking and
file sharing. Ho humm...Slow, but it worked. Security was a big issue there.

Well, when we start implementing (1989-90) Novell Netware into certain work
groups (GMAC), again the WoW!! factor!! Blazing performance even with some
Macs thrown on the novell network. BUT, mac's Apple Talk would reak Holly
havoc on the Novell network,and thus workarounds had to used .. After a while,
the entire business community waited for Apple to fix their Apple-Talk-IP
problems, so Macs could play nice on a Novell Network,But apple just pretty
much thumbed their noses..

So, we (GM)dropped Apples Macs, and went Windows based. And so did most of the Big Three and all Tier 1,2, & three vendors.

The moral to that story is: You don't us what we want and can have (We) Corporations Tell you what we want.. You either deliver or we're moving on..

And so did DTE: Who were mac based up until 1996. Same scenario as above but I almost forgot about apple's Very Poor Customer service.

back in days , Apple treated their customers Big and small like a third world nations. Put plainly, their customer server sucked big time. Then to add insult to injury, they Apple) would drop support for a given Mac while still (supposedly) under warranty. Calls were not returned, promises broken.. Apples dealing with big business was a disaster..

That's were Dell came in riding on his shining horse. back then(90's) Dell built- a great PC with to this day , unheard of customer support.

The G4:

The G4 was OK if you had programmers that would code for the AltiVec engine. If the app was not optimized for the AltiVec, then it was low on the food chain as compared to a AMD K2, Athlon,Athlon XP PIII, P4. There were not That many Mac apps Optimized or coded for the AltiVec. NoT even Paris. Edmund once stated that, re-coding most apps for the altivec would be too cost prohibitive and very time consuming..

So, yes on paperthe G4 was cool, but it neverlived up to it's potential.

James, I call then as I see them. I was @ the the Digidesign /Emagic pony show back in 1995 where they were showing Logic Audio 3.0 on the mac and the newly windows version. The Emagic and Digi guys were just snikering away about how they really never tested the perormance on the windows version,and pretty much stated that it was best if we all went witha mac.. Well.. They into their presentation and started to do side by side Logic routines on both version of Logic.

Well, to their disbelief, the Windos based version of Logic was finnishng all of their task much faster than the Mac. Even the Digi guys were astounded. The Emagic guys were just as stunned. In every side by side they did, the PC ran cirles around the supposedly superior mac . Well, needless to say, after that pony was over, The Southfield Guitar Center sold 8 copies of Logic Audio Windows (Including me)..ZERO copies of the Mac version..

Back to macs don't need support: Dude aare you kidding!!! The Mac is just a Personal Computer. Just like we support SGI(Unix) Sun Solaris PC's (Unix) etc.. All Personal computers need IT support. Do you think everybody who works a 9-5 knows about an operating system.??

Just ask Thad if his comany needs an IT guy/Gal in a Mac centric company..Are

you kidding..

Hell, one of the new requirements of the modern Recording Engineer is to have some IT skills (Networking, Building, repair). I work in a studio which has 4 Macs..(2 -G5s, 2 G4(dual877). Man, because of the volume of work those formentioned macs, even on PT -HD3, those mac will crash..And crash Hard..
