As an owner and avid user of SAM going back to the days when it was called SEKD Red Roaster, I was troubled when the company agreed in 2004/5 to be purchased by Logic. I am sure I wasn't the only one to write Sven when it was announced that Logic would do all the talking as to what would happen to SAM and they weren't talking. In fact, the first move logic made was to take the SAM userboard off the air after almost EVERYONE on it was asking with one voice the same big question. The silence was deafening and folks began jumping the good ship to Sonar, etc. One of the factors was Logic's announcement around that time that they were cutting all support for PC products, period... MAC only.

Finally, news was released that Logic was gonig to regurge SAM. From that time until now, the communication and product support has been stellar. I have used it for mastering only and an occasional editing to time. It is a great tool, looks great, tons of skins out there, great plugs, compressors are tops, easy to use yet altogether powerful, and I really should give it a run as full scale multitrack DAW replacement for PARIS as I do see PARIS and the way I use it becoming increasingly limited as it sits.

MikeAfter jacking around with the Cubase 4 cue mix studio sends, etc. stuff, I

have found it overly complicated and generally redundant when interfacing with the cue mix system I have here. The Furman HDS 16 will allow 16 simultaneous inputs and cubase will allow more than one source to a single output. I have external reverbs on each of the remote mixers so tracking with FX isn't an issue.

It's much easier to just create a mix template that busses mono or stereo inputs directly to mono or stereo outs and then any tracks that are already recorded and used as reference for dubs are just put on a stereo bus and sent to a submix bus stereo out which is routed to the Furman main stereo input and sent to the cans. Using ASIO direct monitoring, I just tracked 18 inputs to a Cubase 4 project at 0.7 ms latency (32k buffer) using the RME beta19 driver. CPU usage on the Cubase meter was around 35-40%. Drop the buffers to 1.5ms latency (64k buffer-still inaudible) and the CPU usage drops to around 10-15%. I like having that kind of headroom.

This is good news. Lots has been going on here behind the scenes and I haven't had much time to get my head around how I would track big projects. I'm getting musicians lined up for some upcoming sessions and I want4ed things to run smoothly. This is easier than doing it with Paris using auxes with my particular cue system..I don't have much experience with this native stuff and I was sorta dreading hitting the latency wall. Doesn't look like that will happen if I'm careful, especially with a slave DAW handling VSTi chores.

This ASIO direct monitoring stuff is nice amd punching in/out is simple and smooth with this system.

(breathing sigh of relief)

Deeji have been tracking at 0.7 ms with ASIO direct monitoring turned off and UAD-1 plugins on the channel inserts. This bumps up the CPU usage a bit and isn't really practical for multitracking.....yet. I can see a time in the next year or so when it will be possible to do what I was wanting to do all along during my "trying to make Paris and Cubase into a single DAW" era. Basically, what I was trying to accomplish was to send a track from the Paris insert to an input channel on the Cubase DAW with a UAD-1 plugin on this channel, process it there in real time at extremely low latency, and return it to the Paris channel. If all Paris channels were routed through Cubase audio channels with live monitoring enabled, whether or not there was a plugin on the Cubase channel insert, this would, in theory, allow Paris to use UAD-1 and other high latency plugins in a *live* scenario with plugin delay compensation being provided by Cubase across all Paris channels. I gave up on this about a year and a half ago due to stability issues with the RME drivers I was using back then. The new RME drivers are a new animal and with the CPU speed of DAWs steadily increasing, I can see this being possible and fairly easy to accomplish in the not-so-distant future. I don't know if I will be the one to do it.....I might.....but someone here surely

will. I'm pretty sure Gene already has done this too. Anyway, it will be interesting to see how this evolves. I'm sure Dimitrios and a few others will be all over it. Those who are running the Creamware cards are prime candidates due to the driver stability of that platform.

I really like the PCM 91 too. In fact the lower priced Lexis are better to my ears than software verbs. Maybe the algos are fine, but the clocking is problematic? The hardware verbs seem to have a solid image with smoother tails.

I haven't worked with Altiverb so I don't know about that one, but sometimes I grab a verb from spacedesigner to create some incidental FX which would take much more time to setup in a hardware unit, but I never use any softwareverb for ongoing instruments (drums-keys)) or vocals. Your mix gets "cloudy" very easily and untransparent. To summ it up, my preferred boxes are: TC6000-Lex300-Lex480 in this order. And if your budget won't let you go there, you might try to get a used M5000 that IMO comes closest to the magic of the 6000.

Consider this, if you got a new Mac, for the first year the MOBO is covered. If you have a problem with the MOBO they will most likely replace it, at no cost. At the end of that year you can add the apple care warranty that covers the machine for two more years. Three years is about the life of a PC anyways. When Apple discontinues a model they sell off the MOBOs to third party Mac repair dealers at vary discounted rates. So after a couple of years you can buy replacement MOBOs a lot cheaper, if you had a problem.

Since your in a rural area, if you had a problem you would call Apple's 800 tech support number. If they could not get you up and running they would have your machine picked up, some times the same day. You'd box your machine up and FedEx would show up to pick it up. Turn around is usually a few days, but often next day. It's a smooth process. If you take it in to an Apple store it's usually same day, while you wait.

Yes the Apple Care extended warranty cost \$249.00 for a MacPro tower, but it's a great way to insure that you will stay up and running and protect your investment. I highly recommend this for any of the portables. Apple care for the consumer models is \$149.00 and \$169.00. Three years worry free, and no wrenching is worth it. There is also Apple's ProCare plan that gives you additional benefits and personal training.

Deej, maybe you should try a Mac Pro tower when they come out with the new models. You could give it a spin for a year and sell it before the warranty runs out, or keep it and get the Apple care extended warranty. Macs retain their value better than a PC, so I don't think it would be that much of a loss. Apple some times runs a 6 month same as cash deal also. The other option is to lease one for a year and write it off as a business expense.

You'd have the best of both worlds.

For \$250 a year, I can buy a new motherboard and cpu for most any PC (after 1-2 years, that's the cost of the board and cpu for most any PC, other than the very leading edge server models (not the stock Mac desktops).

Macs to me have just never made financial sense for that reason. I can also upgrade a PC for \$150 or so to a faster cpu/motherboard without losing the value of the rest of the components. With a Mac, an upgrade pretty much means buying a new Mac. Not a very cost effective investment, imho.

That's where Apple needs to do some soul-searching.

I have had a Receptor for about a year now. Not doing any serious work here with it because, well, I just don't do any serious work with anything. However, the Receptor is great. I love the variety of synths it comes with out of the box, and have added some others, but generally avoided the big commercial and sampler-centric plugs. I eagerly await Muse coming up with a solution for installing my Native Instrument Komplete package.

There are issues, to be sure, with the Receptor, but if you are content with the supported plugins, then it is a fantastic device. If you need more information, visit the forum on the KVR website.

If you are getting no video signal at all then most likely video card,
ram or power supply. If you are getting the bios splash screen but it is

The motherboard could be it but it probably wouldn't be spinning up all

Until you can get hold of an other video card to put in there to confirm

them you likely be grasping at straws.

Once you get the video card. Do this.

make sure the machine is powered off and unplugged! Had to say it :)
reset cmos and plug system in and boot. If still nothing then do these steps and try to boot after doing each one.

Remove any hard drive connections from motherboard

remove any cards from PCI slots

check the 2 power connectors from the power supply re-seat them.

remove all but one stick of ram (usually the one closest to the CPU is the first one)

Try each stick on the first slot to see if there may be a bad stick

If none of this works then it is power supply and/or motherboard. It is very rare for a CPU to die even with power supply melt downs.

Motherboards are designed to die before the meltdown gets to the CPU.

The only thing I see that kills CPUs is heat.

If you reset the CMOS as part of the testing make sure you DO NOT boot in to windows before going into the CMOS and setting the correct date.

If your on XP it can cause you have to reauthorize the OS or if you are using some plug ins they may get messed up the same way.

Deej stated that he doesn't go with Macs because of the problems Rick is having and the expense. It seems that there is a preconceived notion that Macs have the same kind of failure rate as the cheap after market PC MOBOs do. They do not. I thought it was hypocritical of Deej to knock the Mac when he has had so many problems with all the cheap after market MOBOs frying and the problems he has had with other PC parts, such as video cards and drivers. Macs have problems, but they are rare.

A Mac purchase is a pretty safe bet as far as reliability, the cheap after market PC stuff is a whole other story. Deej has proven this over the years with quite a bit of failed PC parts. Yes, Deej knows PC part suckage! Deej does own a G4 400MHz, but he doesn't use Macs, he just knocks them. By the way, I believe his vintage 1999 G4 Mac is still running to this day.

Where Audition has multi-track editing and recording functionality, a host of analytical tools and scientific filters, and is intended to be the primary application in a production, Soundbooth is designed to assist other applications. We found that video and animation production houses rarely had a full-time audio engineer, and frequently needed to send audio work out to a third-party. With long turnarounds and a tendency for audio to get overlooked in the budgeting process, it was getting the short end of the stick. Soundbooth was designed to make it easy for these video and motion graphics designers to perform most of the basic audio tasks themselves.

Both applications have excellent waveform editors, offer spectral frequency editing, a host of built-in effects, high quality resampling, file conversion, etc. Soundbooth also has some features that Audition 2.0 does not: on-screen, non-destructive fades, state-based editing, loop adjustment, and one of our favorites, Automated backing soundtracks. This allows for "stock" music, but of a dynamic length with actual song structure, intros and outros, and keyframable control.

While we acknowledge that Soundbooth is a simpler application, useful to beginners, we also feel it's powerful enough that more advanced users will enjoy it as well. Obviously, it won't substitute for a comprehensive multi-track environment, or for users who want to route through their external effects rack and control their ReWire and Midi devices, but those guys already have a pretty good grasp of the tools and terms, and are comfortable in the applications they already use.

As for porting Audition to the Mac, it's something we have looked into, and that users have been vocal about wanting. I can't say for certain what the future holds, but Audition is based off a decade of Windows-specific code and would take a considerable amount of work and time to port. While I can't speak for the rest of the team or Adobe, I personally would like to see that time and effort put into helping Soundbooth reach feature parity with Audition. Different name, similar functionality, but with the improved workflow concepts that Soundbooth has introduced and multi-platform support.

You just said that computers become obsolete in 9 months. Yes, there is a thing called an upgrade cycle in the computer industry. Have you ever heard of Moore's law? Yes Apple MOBOs cost more to replace than buying an after market MOBO, but it's unlikely that you would have to do that. What does a comparable Dell cost? You wont do that, it's too much. It's so much cheaper to build your own PC with Cheap after market parts. Well have at it! Good luck getting it all to work. You might want to count your time in to the equation and see what it is really costing you.
