pabl've got 31 tracks playing back on a Cubase 4 project with the 2 x HDSP
9652's, a Multiface and 4 x UAD-1 cards on the Gigabyte GA-K8NS Ultra 939
mobo.AMD 64 4800 dual core CPU. I'm running the latest RME beta 17 drivers
at 32k buffers (0.7ms latency) with 23 UAD-1 plugins pushing the UAD-1
resource meter to 92% and the Cubase VST meter is running at around 75-80%.
No crackling or dropouts and I've been inserting these plugins on the
fly.....no crashes. This far exceeds anything that Cubase SX was able to
accomplish with the last RME Alpha driver. I would have been at 1024k
buffers at least and I really doubt I would be able to play back anything
without crackles and oops with the Cubase VST meter at over 60%.

Pretty impressive. I'll be testing out the control room function sooner or
later. We're getting into Paris territory for tracking at these latencies.

I haven't left Paris. I'm just experimenting with stuff trying to mix natively and getting something I like as much as a Paris mix. Mixing on two platforms is sorta driving me nuts and I've been totally spoiled by the feature set. Once I've accomplished that, then maybe I'll mix completely natively. I'm experimenting with a Neve 5042 tape emulator on the Cubase mix bus tonight. I'm also experimenting with some new RME drivers that seem incredibly stable at low latency. I've been pretty happy with the Pulsar cards I've been using as well but what has appealed to me about them is their stability when interfacing with Paris during mixes. I Don't use the synths and plugins that they offer very much and I'm just not convinced tha the Pulsar system will make the jump to 64 bit. I think that's going to be an important jump to make in the future and I want to be ready for it. I'm actually trying to simplify by making things temporarily more complicated and doing a lot of experimentation right now. If I go back to the RME cards for my native platform, I'll likely keep at least one of the Pulsar cards for a farm system and I'll probably keep Paris around for a tracking platform no matter what. I just haven't seen anything yet that functions as smoothly for tracking and for quick punch ins/outs as a Paris system. I'll be giving the plugins that Dimitrios has been talking about a good run on Paris, but I'm so spoiled by the Cubase editor that I sorta doubt I'll be wanting to go back to something else. We'll see though.

Cubase4 Control Room functions, the issues I hated about Totalmix might be a thing of the past. The RME driver is very easy to use and fast to change buffers. Changing buffers in Scope is time consuming and requires a reboot/reload of Windows to be effective. However, the Scope driver is easily as stable as the RME driver and, I think, will probably still operate more efficiently at 1.5 ms latency than the new RME driver according to my preliminary tests. There are also some very cool tools/features to the Scope environment that the totalmix doesn't offer, such as phase alignment in the mixer. I'm trying to make some final decisions as to which native audio platform (RME or CW) to use. Since I don't really use the onboard FX of Scope, the quickness of the RME control panel appeals to me, but the incredible flexibility of the Scope routing window is also appealing. I absolutely hate the Scope midi implementation. I can't seem to get it to work as a midi input/output router for midi controlled external hardware. The RME midi works flawlessly for this. Also, ASIO and mixer channels are limited in the Scope environment and the bigger the project you need to create, the fewer resources you have available because you can't offload any of these functions to your CPU. Once you're out of DSP resources, you're hosed. Both platforms have their advantages/disadvantages. If I can get the RME latency compensation to work on external FX (something I'm having some issues with on Cubase 4 right now) I may just keep one Pulsar card for a farm system and go with the RME cards for the native DAW. the Scope midisuckage and limited DSP (unless you buy the \$1400.00 "pro" cards) make it a bit less appealing to me in some areas since the projects I configure are so large and require so many resources. The CW stability at low latencies and it's Parisfriendliness when synced to Paris ADAT are big plusses. I haven't yet tried syncing the new RME drivers to Paris ADAT. That will happen probably next week. the RME system was so unreliable with my configuration last year that this is the reason I switched to the CW system. However, I have changed and simplified the configuration since then so the RME system may well be happy this time.

When you render with effects with File / Mixdown / Selected tracks you can check add to pool and project window and the render will bring you a new track back in. With this technique you can still add automation as you ride faders/pans/eqs etc. Then disable the effects on the old track or remove it entirely, or drag your new tracks events up to the old one and replace it with the new committed events and delete the newly added track.

CTRL drag will lock it as you drag up and down.

Before you make the jump away from Paris by virtue of reading my posts about the Neve, I would suggest that you try one. It isn't **exactly** the same as the Paris bus. It's something that I like personally, and I like it enough to make the jump to something else. One thing that I like about it is that it is **simple**. You strap it across the stereo bus, dial it in and you're done. No mass of cabling and redundancy like an outboard mixer or external summing device. It is very expensive for what it does though.

When I posted about how much I liked the Pulsar cards, lots of folks jumped and I think that was a good jump. I would recommend this system to anyone. The Pulsar can work on it's own with a native system at very low latencies and also is very stable when interfacing with Paris. It is, in itseldf a very sophisticated mixer and routing system and I like the DSP (and if I was a **snythead** I'd be in heaven* so if you need these things it's a no-brainer. Since I won't be interfacing Pulsar with Paris anymore, I will be selling my 3 x Pulsar cards and the Magma that houses them. If you're interested, shoot me an e-mail. It will make you a monster rig if that's the direction you're headed..

The Neve, OTOH, is basically a very expensive one trick pony. I **definitely** wouldn't bail on Paris based on **my** opinion about it. My advice would be to demo it for at least a week and make a very serious effort to see if you can get what you're looking for with this on large track count mixes before you decide to buy it or to sell your Paris gear.

I've been crunching the I/O port numbers here. I was coming up short on I/O with the MADi so I am reconsidering the MADi . When I think in terms of these systems, I think of the number of I/O ports since I interface a lot of digital gear. My current HDSP rig (2 x 9652's and a Multiface PI) totals 7 x optical I/O ports and 3 stereo coax ports, all usable separately.

The MADi rig with the ADAT bridge would then give me 8 optical ports (either ADAT or spdif optical.....right?) on the MADi bridge plus another spdif optical port on the card for a total of nine that I could interface with outboard devices and use simultaneously.....correct, or no?

Now, if I added my Multiface to this setup, I would be compromising the single PCI card scenario (which appeals to me) for another ADAT port, plus another stereo coax port. This would give me a total of 10 - equal to what I would have with the 3 xHDSP cards I currently use (or 11 if the one on the plate of the MADi card can be used simultaneously), but a net gain of yet another open port because I wouldn't be sacrificing an ADAT port on the MADi bridge for an external A/D converter.

I was wanting to be using as few PCI cards as possible with my setup and three HDSP's along with 4 x Magmas seems like I'm pushing the ragged edge as far as PCI bandwidth goes, but right now, with the GA-K7N8s mobo, it's working. I'm wondering right now, since my performance is good, what the realadvantage would be to going MADi if I have to have the Multiface to achieve the I/O ports I need.

either: I'm mixing some tracks here that were recorded to ProTools by
another guy in a nice Neve room in LA. Tracks are nice and fat...
Trio jazz piano/vocal type stuff... But this piano: tracks are all
set up "Mid - Side"...

So -- I'm an all in the box guy here on my humble Paris system. My
approach for this is to copy the "side" track to another channel, flip
phase, pan the two copies left and right, group those faders and push
them up to taste in combination with the "mid" channel, which is doing
most of the work and is panned -- doh -- center... However, the
session engineer -- an old-school English guy with about 300 times

more experience than I, says he has a better way to decode this. His way: send the "side" channel to an aux (post fader, pre pan), return it to another channel in the mixer (set on "input"), leave them both center panned, the first channel at "0" (nominal gain), then flip phase and push up the return's fader until it nulls -- which it won't, actually... (here I say "huh?" and he says "Yeah, it's a ProTools thing") But anyway, push it up until it "thins out" as far as it's going to... Then, leave that fader right there forever, pan the channels left and right, and control levels for both "sides" with the one fader (of the channel which is sending...). Which works actually very well -- and *does* sound different and better than the "copy channels and flip phase" method... But, in a word -- Why...?!

By the way, in order to do this his way on my rig, I'm sending to an external output -- adat lightpipe looped back to itself -- which is then patched to another mixer channel which is set to active input... Probably introducing some itty-bitty latency here which is why the channels don't null... I'm also going to test this (for kicks) with analog in and out -- but I doubt things will get any better, as there would also be a couple more conversions taking place, and who needs that? One other potential issue: these are 24 bit files at 44.1 -- and I'm wondering if my lightpipe patch for the aux is truncating the signal to 20 bits? (I know this has been discussed in the past, but I'm just dumping all the questions in here now in case anybody wants to actually clarify *everything* for me in one go...)

Thanks, I realize this is rather long-ish... And I'd almost put a smiley-bob here -- if I actually ever did that sort of thing.

I didn't mean a MADI Bridge. I'm talking about the ADI 648 MADI>ADAT converter.

Also, I can get around the port limitations with an ADI4 DD. I am planning on adding 2 x ADI 8DD interfaces anyway to up/downsample my outboard gear for use at higher sample rates so with my POD Pro, Mytek Stereo AD/DA converters and DAC-1 (all of which operate at up to 96k) on my AD4-DD and my outboard gear on a pair of ADI8-DD's, I will have more than enough additional optical ports to handle everything else and can operate all audio I/O routing through a single PCI card. It's more flexible than using the 3 x HDSP cards and when the price of 2 x 64 bit Magma's (ne for the HDSP cards, the other for the RME cards) vs one (for just the RME cards), or even the possibility of needing none (if a new FW, etc. model comes out) or if I can configure all of my UAD-1 cards and the MADI PCI in the 5 PCI slots of my mobo without IRQ wars, the numbers start looking a lot more attractive.
