For recording VSTis I use 2 computers. I have the main one with the whole song on it, set at a high latency, and a I set up a second one with just the individual VSTi active, set at low latency, and while I record the midi data on the main one, I monitor the output from the second one. For playback the main one takes over. I use a mixer of course.

This system works brilliantly and I never have to stress over latencies. I hate doing things that in any way make a client or visiting musician uncomfortable or inconvenienced. This is probably a hold over from running for-hire studios. I don't like anything that unnecessarily draws the artists attention onto the recording process, and any noticeable latency certainly does that.

So, the latency of MLan is not an issue to me.
