Erick,
DJ is just trying to scare you. You can use Paris as a Virtual Mixing Console and get the benefits of its summing bus sound. In this kind of setup you mix from a second computer or Hard-Disk recorder and output individual channels or stems to your Paris computer. You can go into Paris using analog inputs or digital inputs.
Using several ADAT cards seems to be the most effective method, but you do need to be careful about having a solid Master Clock.
If you run Nuendo, Pro Tools, Cubase, Logic, Performer, etc on your other

computer, you will get the benefits of Automatic Delay Compensation, more advanced bussing options, working MIDI, moving fader automation, and all the other features of a 2006 DAW plus the Paris sound.

I was reading some where on the net, where there was a debate about the
cost factor. Somebody stated that they could build a PC with the same configuration
as the Mac Pro for about a thousand dollars. Another guy pointed out that
the processors alone are about \$1500.00. Another guy pointed out that the
DIY guys need to add in \$299.00 on top of their hardware estimates for Microsoft
XP pro to be fair, because they usually don't.

Another guy was saying that when he built a PC and had problems with components
working properly. He called the manufacturer and they blamed Microsoft,
when he called Microsoft they blamed the manufacturer. He could never get
either one of them to take responsibility and warranty the products. His
claim was that he had problems with multi components that were never resolved,
and he spent a lot of time on the phone and a lot of time trying to fix the
problems himself. I'm sure that this is only one guys bad experience. I
know I haven't had those kind of problems with my home built PCs yet, however,
the warranty issue is something to consider.

I still don't see any thing on the prebuilt PC side that is on the level of the Mac Pro, as far as features / price. I guess the debate will go on.

I for one hope that Apple puts out a cheaper tower capable of doing some serious A/V work.

Maybe.....if the old and new mobo uses the VIA chipset. I have =
moved system drives from a mobos running VIA chipsets to mobo's (same =
same or different brands) running newer versions of VIA chipsets and it =
was as simple as just loading the new drivers. I have never had any luck =
moving from a VIA chipset to any other chipset and have never tried this =
with any other kind of other *older to newer* version of chipset other =
than VIA. It might be worth a try if you're moving from an older mobo =
with something like an older NForce to a newer NForce chipset, but be =
sure to Ghost (or whatever backup you use) first, just in case. If =
you're swapping chipsets, do a clean install.
