Like I said, I guess I just assumed everyone had a VST Plugins folder in place. Mine's always been named "VSTPlugins". I think that's the standard Steinberg name for the folder, but I'm not positive. I actually reinstalled Drumagog just now to make sure I wasn't talking out my ass and apparently, another program demo I recently tried out had installed another "VSTPlugins" folder and Drumagog asked me which one it should use.

Again, I'm sorry if I sounded condescending, but when you ask a question, get one reply, and then jump back in saying none of what you were told on

>Hi SF,

I used to run PARIS and Logic together (a few years ago now), but have found that having 2 PCs (one for PARIS and one for Logic / Cubase / whatever) is definitely the way to go. As Aaron says, the computer for Paris doesn't need to be all that flash. My setup goes like this:-

PARIS System
 Asus A7N8X-E
 1GB TwinX (2 x 512) RAM
 200GB system drive, 3 partitions (W98SE, WXPpro, storage area)
 2 x 120GB audio drives (I keep a backup of everything on the second audio drive)

3 EDS cards
MEC 1 - 2 x 8 in analog card and 1 x ADat
MEC 2 - 1 x ADat card

Logic System
Mac G5
RME HDSP 9652

I use lightpipes and coax S/PDIF to get VST instruments and some audio tracks into PARIS from Logic, and audio from PARIS to Logic. Basically I use PARIS as a summing box. PARIS is the MTC master.

This sounds something like what you're planning to do.

There's a few "gotchas" with setting up a PARIS system on Windows XP, for example you have to install certain software components in a particular order, and for some reason you can't have two ADat cards on one MEC, but with a few workarounds you'll end up with good-quality AD/DA conversion, and a really nice mixing environment. The only thing that's missing really is flying faders.

There's lots of information around on the net, but if you get stumped I can send you the documentation you'll need to get started.

that I use to patch the Multiface converters into my Paris rig via Paris
lightpipe fro tracking. I like them both. The Paris and Multiface converters
sound different from each other. I sometimes prefer the Multiface converters
to the Paris on some sources depending on the source, the mic and the
preamp.

I always track to Paris using the Paris converters, RME converters and Mytek
converters, batch convert them to .wavs, import them to a second DAW running
Cubase, then lightpipe them back to Paris during mixdown. This allows me to
take advantage of the PDC and editor in SX and the automation in both
systems.

There's a lot more to getting this to happen than I have described. If you decide you want to go there, I have attached a word.doc that explains how it is done.

I prefer the Paris mix bus to the one in SX and unless you just like the sound of the Mackie mixer for some reason, you'll likely be happy with Paris if you use it's strengths and accept it's limitations.

aren't nearly as accommodating as Rim Buntinas is and sometimes we have to work together through trial and error to figure stuff out.

Though I've never meant many of the people I talk with here, I have a definite sense that they are my friends and many times the banter tends to be jovial. Neve sound... not quite hyped, but more extended & defined, maybe - is the way I'd describe it. Although if that mic is already pretty warm-sounding, that combination might prove too much in that department... might come across as a big "bump" in the low-mids.

Now, if you just hate the mic overall, but want something to match up nicely with the Great River, I'm sure you can find lots of options, depending on your price range... good ol' u-87 never totally sucks (except can be midrange-honk-y on male vox sometimes, if yaknowhutahmean); TLM-103... warmth of the GR should help take some of the edge off; and the Baby Bottle totally ROCKS on male vox, and would (IME) pair well with the somewhat Neve-ishness of the Great River - I've used a Baby Bottle through a Neve 1073 & an original LA-2A and it killed on male (hard rock/metal) vocals.

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If you want to try a Baby Bottle, and/or a Blueberry, I'd consider lending you one of each of mine in exchange for you lending me the 4060 for awhile... I'd be curious to see how the 4060 sounded through My Chandler TG2. We'd have to agree on a set amount of time for the mics to be away, and each agree to pay shipping to & from on each end so it'd be fair, but I'm always interested in trying new combinations that might serve to enlighten, so let me know if that might be an option you want to consider.

Honestly, though, I think your best & easiest bet might be to grab a Muscusrite Red Series & try that 4060 out through that & see what you think.

A: We are now developing a network of ENSONIQ Digital Systems dealers. We are looking for dealers who are best qualified to sell and support PARIS. The official dealer list will be announced as we get closer to the launch date.

Q3: What are the features of the Interface 442?

A: The Interface 442 is a 1U rack-mountable enclosure which connects to the EDS-1000 PCI card. It provides four analog inputs, four analog outputs and one stereo digital input and output (S/PDIF), as well as an external sync input and output and a connector for an Interface 2 module. The front panel has eight analog signal level indicators as well as sync and sample rate status LEDs.

Q4: What are the features of the Interface MEC?

A: The Interface MEC comes with four analog inputs, four analog outputs, one stereo digital input and output (S/PDIF), external sync input and output connectors, and a front panel headphone output as standard features, and can accommodate up to nine additional expansion modules. The expansion modules typically contain two, four or eight inputs or outputs, depending on the function and type of connectors used on the module. For example, when XLR connectors are required for analog outputs, there are four per module. Another example is the ADAT interface, which will provide eight inputs and outputs on a single module. Each EDS-1000 card can be connected to one Interface 442 or Interface MEC, providing a total of up to 20 inputs and 20 outputs per card. The maximum system configuration will be three to four cards typically, and is limited by the number of available PCI slots as well as CPU speed and power.

Q5: What are the minimum computer requirements for PARIS?

A: As we get closer to the release of PARIS we will have more specific information on computer requirements and compatibility. Based on preliminary testing

we feel that PARIS will work efficiently on a computer with a 120 MHz or higher PowerPC or a 133 or higher Pentium. Compatible computers must have at least one available full-size PCI slot.

Q6: What file formats does PARIS use and support?

A: PARIS supports Sound Designer II/Pro Tools, .WAV and AIFF file formats, in addition to the special optimized native PARIS 24-bit format.

TOP

Q7: How will PARIS implement automation?

A: All standard mixer controls, including faders, panning and effect returns, will be automated.

TOP

Q8: Will PARIS have good plug-in effects?

A: The quality of our plug-in effects is very high. The same superb effects that are available in our new fully professional DP/Pro 24-bit Effects Processor will be available for PARIS, and we have received inquiries from numerous third-party plug-in developers about providing support for PARIS.

TOP

Q9: Can PARIS accept FX plug-ins?

A: We have also been contacted by many of the 3rd party plug-in manufacturers and are working with them to ensure that there will be many plug-ins available for PARIS as soon as possible.

TOP

Q10: Will PARIS be compatible with Intel MMX processors?

A: PARIS will be compatible with MMX processors, and we intend to provide specific support for MMX capabilities as well as multiple processors. While this support may not be available in the initial release, it will be implemented as soon as possible.

TOP

Q11: How many channels can you include in a submix?

A: The submix of the current 16 channels being mixed is invisibly computed and updated continuously while you are working, and should never take longer than one pass to compute. Depending on the number of EDS-1000 cards in the system, the speed of the CPU and the capabilities of the disk subsystem, more than one 16 channel submix may be computed in real time (as opposed to using the "invisible" submix tracks).

Q12: Will PARIS provide QuickTime support?

A: We are planning to offer support for QuickTime in PARIS, but more detailed information is not available at this time.

TOP

Q13: Which digital sequencer software program will work with PARIS?

A: ENSONIQ has been contacted by almost every software sequencer manufacturer on the market today regarding this subject. We believe that compatibility is important and are developing a program which will allow other software programs to use our hardware. At the recent Frankfurt Musikmesse, we had meetings with several leading manufacturers including Steinberg and Emagic, who expressed interest in adapting their products to support the PARIS hardware.

Q14: What are the MIDI capabilities of the PARIS sequencer?

A: The PARIS sequencer will allow MIDI data to be managed transparently within the same editing environment as the audio data, and should prove to be a viable and attractive alternative to other dedicated sequencer applications. PARIS version 1.0 will include all commonly used MIDI sequencer features, including support for Standard MIDI Files (SMF), sophisticated non-destructive quantization, and both event list and "piano roll" editing of MIDI data.

Q15: How many simultaneous playback channels can PARIS have (8?, 16?, 24?)?

A: A single card system will support a minimum of 16 simultaneous real-time playback tracks, and probably more, up to the limits of the disk subsystem, the CPU and the cards installed. You are always working within one of the eight 16-channel submixes.
TOP

Q16: How many inputs and outputs can each EDS-1000 card handle?

A: One EDS-1000 card can handle a maximum of 20 inputs and 20 outputs when connected to an Interface MEC with the appropriate expansion modules installed.
TOP

Q17: How will PARIS handle dithering?

A: PARIS will be able to mix down to stereo master tracks which can be compiled into a CD master image file suitable for use with CD mastering software. It is possible that some of these features may be included in the PARIS application.
TOP

Q18: Can I do all my mixing and analog I/O through PARIS, without using a mixer?

A: PARIS will have everything needed except microphone pre-amps, and we expect to be offering them as another option in the future.

The Paris assets page

Things that are missing:

A dedicated file page, with files like BT's SMPTE file, DeeJ's setup, file, or direct links to Chuck's Plugin page. The guy that comes on the NG for the first time three months from now, will miss out because he won't know that they even exist. If he found them, his next question would be how to install them, a page would come in handy for this and similar things like this, where additional instruction are needed.

How to cook in Paris!

Paris recipes, tips and tricks. Have each guy that wants to, list their favorite and most useful tip or trick. There are subjects that could be covered better, like free form mode, or automation, etc. Recipes, for example, a recipe for your favorite way to record electric bass with Paris. List things like equipment used, settings, type of strings used, mic placement, materials used such as wind screen or packing blankets, and where you got them.

Paris Directory

In stead of having more web pages and our personal information floating around in cyber space, that can easily be sniffed, have a down loadable pdf or Word document that would have a bio with contact information, our interest, what instruments we play, etc. This could be set up in a standardized templet form.

The Paris Players Directory

An idea that kind of piggybacks the Directory idea, it would be a Paris Players Directory. The directory would list what instruments you play, what style or genera of music. It would be a directory of volunteer musicians that would be willing to play on up to three tracks for free or for one dollar.

This would be like having a community of hired guns that could spice up your tracks. If the track is used, you would just agree to give acknowledgment for the track. If a song or work actually sold nationally, you would still get performance royalties. It could be worked out. We would all get to know each other even better.

It is fast and easy to send files direct via Instant Messaging software. so shooting Paris project file across the net would be easy. We could pay pal each other, or what ever. Again this could be set up in a templet. All of us have some kind of studio, and all of us have some kind of talent, lets utilize it! This would work kind of like DeeJ's cyber band idea. Together we could create great music that we could have never created alone.

In any case you could list people's rates for those who aren't free. In fact it's probably a damned brilliant business idea in that context. A worldwide internet muso for hire directory. People could charge anything from nothing, credit acknowledgement, to royalty or rates, or both. Have samples... list styles and what instruments a person has.

Got any web design skills? ;o) You could be rich! ;o)

Actually, seriously, you have a lot of ideas in here overall. The Paris community does appear to be slowly but surely shrinking. You have a lot of ideas, and I'm sure many of them would be appreciated were you to put something together. I'm sure certain mainstays, such as ParisFaq's and this site, will be here for many years to come, but we're all keen to see new additions. :o) And I'll happily link to anything that you create that's Paris related.

Where exactly Paris magic happens? Is it AD converters, summing or something else? Is there any "sonical" reason to record tracks in Paris if I have cubase/rme DAW which I am familiar with?

Now, I will try to explain what I miss with cubase/rme setup.

I compose electronic music, and I use a lot of older analog synths and samplers, which sounds VERY nice, much better then newer stuff. When I just route them directly to analog desk, everything is fine. It is really easy to mix a song because every instrument finds its place in the mix easily. Everything sounds full, fat and in-your-face with nice 3D space.

When recording same instruments with RME, I loose this character of original sound. Everything gets behind, tracks sound separated (not "glued" together) but the biggest disadvantage is that I loose a lot of "space" (created with older lexicon reverbs). It is more 2D instead of 3D.

In other words...when I mix analog, it is very easy to find the right level.

In digital, it is either to loud or to quiet.

Final question. Does Paris converters/mixbus behave more like analog gear/desk... or closer to sterile cubase/rme digital stuff?

My production is not about hi-fi, details and such... I just look for natural, fat, full bodied sound. Is Paris the right place to look for these?

Or is it just closer to analog than Protools but not quite analog?

well I wasn't just thinking of Paris files, but it would make us more compatible with each other.

I have been thinking about doing this as a business, and I intend to do so in time. Making it a profitable business model is a whole other story.

I thought it would be something that would help all of us out at one time or another. I was thinking UP to 3 free tracks to get started, you could pay for the track you use maybe, and if somebody wanted more they could pay for more based on somebody's set rate. It would be great to be able to choose from a pool of talent. I'll bet there are some great players here. The concept of having a rock song that has something missing and putting it out to five different players, and having the track come back with something that fits so well. Something that you have just never thought of. Have a jazz guitarist lay down a track on your funk project. Michael Jackson did this kind of thing on the song "Beat it" when he had Eddie Van Halen a rock guitarist, lay down the guitar tracks.

This could lead to work and income for our studios. As an example, I write all kinds of music, If I wrote a country song, but I don't play fiddle, I could look in the Directory for somebody that has it in their profile. So say somebody in CO.;) has a hot fiddle player that he works with, I could send him the tracks with a keyboard melody of basically how I want the fiddle part to go. The experienced fiddle player could play the melody and fill in the nooks and crannies. That could change the whole dynamic of the song. The best part, everybody would get paid. This could also showcase our talents as players and engineers.
